The successful candidate will be able to provide individual student support and counseling and be responsible for creating and implementing school programming that fosters the social-emotional learning, stress management and resiliency of students and faculty. This is a ten-month teaching position, but some summer work may be required. Responsibilities will include but are not limited to:

Responsibilities:

- Work with students, teachers, parents, and outside professionals to maximize student success
- Manage and support the implementation of a school wide SEL curriculum
- Teach occasional classroom lessons aimed at increasing social and emotional aptitude
- Collaborate with teachers and administrators regarding individual students
- Provide counseling/consultation sessions with individual students and parents
- Perform observations and make recommendations for interventions to support the academic, behavioral, and social success of students
- Analyze outside educational testing and develop educational accommodation plans for individual students as needed
- Provide referrals to professionals outside of school for more intensive psychological support; work as a liaison with these outside professionals to support their work and generalize interventions in the school setting
- Participate in academic support meetings
- Support in and lead crisis management and consultation
- Provide support and resources to parents and the larger Cranbrook Educational Community through presentations, written resources, and discussion
- Collaborate with other counseling staff on school-wide initiatives (e.g., faculty in-service presentations, community talks, etc.)

Qualifications:

- Graduate degree in clinical psychology, counseling, social work or a related field. Experience in a school setting working with elementary age students is important.
- Three-five years of related work experience.
- Independent school experience preferred
- Flexibility, a desire to collaborate, and strong oral and written communication skills
- A knowledge of current law and best clinical practices is expected
- The ability to observe confidentiality is essential
